# Why Aviation Matters to States

# Chicago Convention 1944

## Foundation of Modern International Civil Aviation

- **Core Principles**
  - Sovereignty of States over airspace.
  - Safety and security of international civil aviation.
  - Uniformity in international aviation standards.
  - Cooperation among contracting States.
- **Relevance in Dispute Resolution**
  - Regulatory compliance disputes.
  - Airspace access and overflight rights.
  - Licensing and operational authorizations.
  - State responsibility for aviation oversight.
- **State Attorney Perspective**

# Montreal Convention 1999

  - Unlimited liability where negligence is proven.
- **Important Features**
  - Jurisdictional flexibility.
  - Advance payments to victims.
  - Electronic documentation.
  - Consumer-oriented protections.
