**ORDER**

---

THE TERRITORIAL (FRINGE BENEFITS) WAGES COUNCIL (ESTABLISHMENT) ORDER, 1965

Whereas the Minister for Labour is of the opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of the terms of employment commonly referred to as "fringe benefits" of certain employees in Tanganyika.

NOW THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 6 of the Regulation of Wages and Terms of Employment Ordinance, the Minister for Labour hereby makes the following Order:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Territorial (Fringe Benefits) Wages Council (Establishment) Order, 1965.

(2) In this Order, "fringe benefits" means any benefits, other than cash wages or overtime or bonus payments, accruing to an employee as a consequence of his employment which represent additions to the labour cost to the employer.

2.—(1) There is hereby established a Wages Council (hereinafter referred to as the Wages Council) to perform, in relation to fringe benefits and in respect of the employees specified in the Schedule hereto, the powers and functions specified in that behalf in the Regulation of Wages and Terms of Employment Ordinance.

(2) The Council shall, if it is of the opinion that separate provision should be made in respect of employment in different sectors of employment, make separate recommendations in respect of such different sectors.

3. The Wages Council shall consist, as to members, of a chairman and a deputy chairman and, as to representative members, of not more than four persons to represent employers and not more than four persons to represent employees.

4. An officer of the Ministry of Labour shall be the Secretary of the Council.

SCHEDULE

All employees in Tanganyika other than persons in the service of the United Republic, persons in the service of the Common Services Organization or any self-contained service thereof, persons in the service of a Local Government Authority if their terms and conditions of employment are subject to the power of regulation of the Local Government Service Commission, or members of the Unified Teaching Service.

THE CUSTOMS TARIFF ORDINANCE

ORDER

Under section 6

THE CUSTOMS TARIFF (REMISSION OF CUSTOMS DUTIES) (TIPER)

ORDER, 1965

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Tariff (Remission of Customs Duties) (Tiper) Order, 1965.

2. The whole of the import duties and suspended duties payable in respect of the goods specified in the Schedule hereto are hereby remitted.

SCHEDULE

All Storage tanks, Radio system from refinery to oil jetty machinery and equipment for electrical and mechanical workshops, equipment and furniture for chemical laboratory, spare parts for machinery and equipment of refinery, oil jetty loading and unloading equipment which the Commissioner of Customs is satisfied are for the construction and establishment of an oil refinery pursuant to an agreement dated 19th June, 1963, made between the Government of Tanganyika and Italian Petroleum Refining Company Limited.
