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THE TANGANYIKA ORDERS IN COUNCIL, 1920 TO 1960

PROCLAMATION

Under Article 7

ESTABLISHMENT OF DISTRICTS

In exercise of the powers vested in me by Article 7 of the Tanganyika I.L. (5)
Orders in Council 1920 to 1960, I, RICHARD GORDON TURNBULL, Knight pp. 5 and 16
Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint
George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Tanganyika, do hereby
proclaim and notify as follows:—

The Schedule to the Establishment of Districts Proclamation, as amended from time to time, is hereby further amended as follows:—

- (a) by deleting in the description of the area of the Masai District the I.L. (7)
following words, occurring between the ninth and twenty-eighth p. 6
lines thereof, “thence.....01 Donyo Lol-Guberi” and by
substituting therefor the following:—

“thence to a point on the northern shore of Lake Eyasi due south of the Serengeti National Park Beacon No. (SNP. 41); thence north-eastwards along the northern shore of Lake Eyasi to its junction with the Olgedju-Olbossare Stream; thence north-eastwards along the said stream to its bifurcation at Sendeos; thence north-eastwards by the southern arm of the Olgedju-Olbossare Stream to its junction with the Ngorongoro Forest Reserve; thence eastwards by the southern boundary of the Ngorongoro Forest Reserve to its junction with the Rift Valley escarpment; thence along the top of the escarpment to the Kiruruma River; thence following the course of the Kiruruma River in a south-easterly direction to the point where it crosses the Makuyuni/Oldeani Local Main Road; thence following the boundary of the Lake Manyara National Park in a southerly, easterly and southerly direction to the point where the boundary crosses the mouth of the Oltukai River where it runs into Lake Manyara; thence following the course of the Oltukai River in an easterly direction to the bridge on the Great North Road at Kwakuchinja; thence in a straight line in a south-easterly direction to Ol Donyo-Lol-Guberi”.

- (b) by deleting all that part of the description of the area of the Mbulu I.L. (7)
District from the word “thence” occurring in the thirtieth line p. 7
thereof to the word “cairn” occurring in the last line thereof
inclusive and by substituting therefor the following:—

“thence in an east-north-easterly direction to Ol Donyo-Lol-Guberi; thence in a straight line in a north-westerly direction to the bridge on the Great North Road at Kwakuchinja; thence following the course of the Oltukai River in a westerly direction to the point where the boundary of the Lake Manyara National Park crosses the mouth of the Oltukai River where it runs into Lake Manyara; thence following the boundary of the Lake Manyara National Park in a northerly, westerly, and northerly direction to the point where the Kiruruma River crosses the Makuyuni/Oldeani local main road; thence following the course of the Kiruruma River in a north-westerly direction to the top of the Rift Valley escarpment; thence along the top of the escarpment to its junction with the Ngorongoro Forest Reserve; thence westwards by the southern boundary of the Ngorongoro Forest Reserve to its junction with the southern arm of the Olgedju-Olbossare Stream to the bifurcation of the said stream at Sendeos; thence south-westwards along the said stream to its junction with Lake Eyasi; thence south-westwards along the northern shore of Lake Eyasi to a point due south of the Serengeti National Park Beacon No. SNP. 41; thence due south to the aforesaid cairn on the southern shore.”
