THE CONSTITUTION OF TANGANYIKA

REGULATIONS

Made under section 85

THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1962

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Public Service Commission (Amendment) Regulations, 1962, and shall be read as one with the Public Service Commission Regulations, 1961 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations").

2. Regulation 2 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by deleting the definition "African" therein and by substituting the following new definition:—

"'African' means a citizen of Tanganyika who is a person of African race and includes any such citizen who is a Swahili or either of whose parents is, or if deceased was, a person of African race;"

3. Regulation 22 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by deleting paragraphs (1), (2), (3) and (4) and by substituting the following new paragraphs:—

"(1) As between candidates who are eligible and suitable for appointment, preference will be given—

- (a) firstly, to Africans in the public service, provided that the Commission will give preference to an African from outside the service who is suitable and substantially better qualified than any African who is a public officer;
- (b) secondly, to Africans who are not in the public service;
- (c) thirdly, to citizens of Tanganyika, other than Africans, who are serving in the public service on pensionable terms;
- (d) fourthly, to persons, other than Africans, who are serving in the public service on pensionable terms with Class L privileges, but who are not citizens of Tanganyika;
- (e) fifthly, to persons, other than Africans, who are serving in the public service on pensionable terms with Class O leave privileges, but who are not citizens of Tanganyika; and
- (f) lastly, to any other persons.

(2) As between officers having the same degree of preference, qualifications, experience, proved merit and suitability for the post in question will be given greater weight than seniority."
