THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE

(CAP. 333)

BY-LAWS

*Made by the Nzega District Council under section 59 of the Local
Government Ordinance*

THE NZEGA DISTRICT COUNCIL (ANIMAL DISEASES) BY-LAWS, 1962

1. These By-laws may be cited as the Nzega District Council (Animal Short title Diseases) By-laws, 1962.

2. In these By-laws—

Definitions

“Council” means the Nzega District Council or any person authorized by them in writing to act on their behalf under these By-laws;

“Animal” has the meaning ascribed to it in the Animal Diseases Ordinance;

“Owner” means the person at whose premises the animal is normally kept;

“Veterinary Officer” has the meaning ascribed to it in the animal Diseases Ordinance.

3. In order to prevent the spread of disease, the Council may cause to be examined, quarantined, inoculated, sprayed, dipped, washed or otherwise disinfected any animal or have it dealt with in such manner as they, on the advice of a Veterinary Officer, may deem necessary, or direct that the owner of any animal shall treat or deal with such animal as aforesaid.

4. In order that animals may be dealt with as provided for in by-law 3 the Council may publish a notice requiring all owners or individual owners to bring their animals, within a period of not less than fourteen days from the date of publication, to such place as is specified in the notice.

5. Such notice shall be published by being displayed at the Council's Offices and at the Local Courts of the areas concerned, and its contents shall be made known in such manner as is customary.

6. Any owner to whom such notice when published applies, who fails to carry out any requirement herein shall be guilty of an offence.

7. Any person who fails to carry out any verbal order given for the purposes of by-law 3 by the Council, shall be guilty of an offence.

8. Anyone committing an offence against these By-laws shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months, or to both such fine and imprisonment. If after conviction a person still fails to comply with an order issued under these By-laws he shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty shillings a day during the period of his default.

THE AFRICAN CHIEFS ORDINANCE

(CAP. 331)

ORDER

ORDER FOR THE DEPOSITION OF A CHIEF

Whereas I, RASHIDI MFAUME KAWAWA, Prime Minister, am satisfied after due inquiry that the deposition of Chief HUSSEIN MWANDU MAKWAIA from the office of Chief of Usiha in the Shinyanga District, being an office of chief within the meaning of the African Chiefs Ordinance, is necessary in the interests of peace, order and good government:

Now therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor-General by subsection (1) of section 13 of the African Chiefs Ordinance, and transferred to me by the Transfer of Powers and Duties (No. 2) Order, 1962, I, the said RASHIDI MFAUME KAWAWA, Prime Minister, do hereby depose the said Chief HUSSEIN MWANDU MAKWAIA from the said office of Chief of Usiha.
