

(3) In every case in which an appeal is lodged, the punishment shall be suspended during the hearing of the appeal.

(4) For the avoidance of doubt it is hereby declared that where any punishment has been imposed by the Director under the provisions of sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (2) of Rule 5 no appeal in respect thereof shall lie under the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Rule.

9.—(1) All fines imposed on a defaulter in respect of offences against discipline under these Rules may be recovered by stoppage of the defaulter's allowance due at the time of committing such offence and thereafter accruing due. Fines to be recovered by stoppage of allowance

(2) The amount of stoppage in respect of any punishment authorized by these Rules shall be in the discretion of the appropriate tribunal by whom the punishment was imposed or subject to the directions of the Director but shall in no case exceed one-half of the monthly allowance of the defaulter and whenever more than one order of stoppage is in force against the same serviceman, so much only of his allowance shall be stopped as shall leave him a residue of at least one-half of his allowance.

(3) Where more than one order of stoppage is made upon the same serviceman, the orders later in date shall, if necessary, be postponed as to their enforcement until the earlier orders have been discharged.

10. The Director or a commanding officer, where a charge alleging an offence against discipline or an offence against the Act has been laid or is about to be laid against a serviceman, may suspend that serviceman from the performance of his duties with the National Service.

RULES

Under section 21

THE NATIONAL SERVICE (GENERAL) RULES, 1965

1. These Rules may be cited as the National Service (General) Rules, 1965.

ORGANIZATION OF NATIONAL SERVICE

Composition
of National
Service

2. The National Service shall consist of the following ranks in order of seniority as follows: —

Senior Officers:

The Director.
Assistant Directors.
Senior Masters.
Masters.
Assistant Masters.

Other Ranks:

Chief Guides.
Senior Guides.
Guides.
Deputy Guides.
Assistant Guides.
Cadet Guides (Grade I).
Cadet Guides (Grade II).

Branches

3.—(1) The National Service shall be organized into four branches namely: —

- (i) the Central Headquarters;
- (ii) the Training Corps;
- (iii) the Engineering Corps;
- (iv) the Farming Corps.

(2) The Director may constitute and designate units and sub-units in each branch of the service.

PROMOTION

Promotion
of other
ranks

4. Promotion of servicemen to ranks other than Senior Officers shall require the recommendation of the commanding officer of the servicemen and shall be confirmed by the Ministry.

Promotion
to fill
vacancies

5. Provided there is a vacancy in the authorized establishment of the branch or unit a serviceman may be promoted to the next higher rank in the National Service for which he is qualified for promotion.

Eligibility
based on
seniority

6. Eligibility for promotion shall, unless the Director in any case directs otherwise, depend on the seniority of the serviceman in the rank in which he is serving.

ALLOWANCES

Allowances

7. The scale of allowances payable to servicemen shall be determined by the Director from time to time provided that the scale of allowances may not be altered to the prejudice of servicemen employed in the National Service at the effective date of any alteration.

UNIFORM

Uniform

8. The Director may, from time to time make regulations concerning the pattern and amount of uniform and kit generally to be issued to servicemen.
