

THE PRODUCE EXPORT ORDINANCE

(CAP. 137)

RULES

Under section 10

THE PRODUCE EXPORT (CASTOR SEED) RULES, 1965

1. These Rules may be cited as the Produce Export (Castor Seed) Rules, 1965, and shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of March, 1965.

2. In these Rules—

“Castor Seed” means the seed of *Ricinus communis*.

3. No person shall export or cause or permit to be exported or attempt to export from Tanganyika any Castor Seed except in “B” twill, new or sound, second-hand bags, which contain less than 146 lb. net weight of Castor Seed and which are sewn and marked in accordance with these Rules.

4. Every bag containing Castor Seed for export shall be securely sewn to the satisfaction of a Customs Officer or Produce Inspector either:

- (a) by hand, using double thread, or
- (b) by machine, using two rows of stitching,

so that none of the contents of the bag is visible nor may escape through the mouth of the bag.

5. Every bag containing Castor Seed for export shall be marked:

- (1) with a broad band of red paint or dye from end to end across the mouth of the bag; and
- (2) with the words CASTOR SEED in red in block letters not less than two inches in height.

6. No person shall store or cause or permit to be stored any Castor Seed intended for export in the same store or building as any edible commodity or outside a building in contact with any edible commodity.

7. The Produce Export (Castor Seed) Rules, 1953, are hereby revoked.
