6. Any person who is appointed to the permanent service of the Council after having served in a temporary capacity may at his option and subject to the consent of the Council, be permitted to count such temporary service as permanent service for the purpose of these Regulations, and in such event such person shall pay to the Fund the contributions due for the period of such service and the Council shall pay to the Fund an equivalent sum as a bonus.

7. Subject to the provisions of these Regulations every depositor shall pay monthly into the Fund a sum equal to ten per cent of his basic salary for the month in respect of which payment is made, and this sum shall be known as the deposit. The deposit calculated to the nearest five cents shall be deducted from his monthly basic salary by the Council. No deposit shall be made in respect of any period other than an unbroken period of a calendar month.

8. The Council shall, as soon as possible after the end of each calendar month, remit to the Fund a sum equal to the total deposits made by all depositors in respect of that month together with an equivalent sum payable by the Council as bonus under the principal Regulations.

9. Depositors will be notified of the amount standing to their credit at regular intervals as prescribed in the principal Regulations.

THE PRODUCE CESS ACT, 1962
(No. 53 OF 1962)

ORDER

Made under section 3

THE PRODUCE CESS (NORTH MARA DISTRICT COUNCIL) ORDER, 1963

1. This Order may be cited as the Produce Cess (North Mara District Council) Order, 1963, and shall come into force on the twelfth day of July, 1963.

2. In this Order—

“Co-operative Society” means a co-operative society registered under the Co-operative Societies Ordinance;

Cap. 211

“market” means a market established, or deemed to have been established, by the North Mara District Council under the provisions of the Local Government Ordinance.

Cap. 333

3. There shall be imposed on the produce specified in column one of the Schedule hereto which is bought and sold in a market within or exported from the area of the jurisdiction of the North Mara District Council a cess payable at the rate specified in column two of the said Schedule:

Provided that this Order shall apply to a first purchase and sale in a market or export, as the case may be, and that cess shall not be payable on a subsequent purchase and sale or export of the same produce.

4. The cess shall be due and payable by the buyer or exported at the time of purchase and sale or export, as the case may be:

Provided that where any produce to which this Order applies has been delivered for sale to a Co-operative Society the cess shall become due and payable by such society at the time of payment of the proceeds of sale to it.

5.—(1) Where the purchase and sale is in a market the cess shall be payable to the Market Clerk who shall receive the same for and on behalf of the North Mara District Council and shall issue a receipt therefor.

(2) Where produce, which is not bought and sold in a market, is exported from the area of jurisdiction of the North Mara District Council or is delivered for sale to a Co-operative Society, the exporter or the Co-operative Society, as the case may be, shall pay the cess to the North Mara District Council through its Treasury.

6. No produce to which this Order applies and which has been bought and sold in a market on which any cess is due and remains unpaid shall be removed from such market.
