THE CUSTOMS TARIFF ORDINANCE

(Cap. 346)

**ORDER**

*Under section 6*

THE CUSTOMS TARIFF (REMISSION OF CUSTOMS DUTIES) (TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE) (GENERAL) ORDER, 1965

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Tariff (Remission of Customs Duties) (Technical Assistance) (General) Order, 1965.

2. The whole of the import duties and suspended duties payable by the categories of person mentioned in the Schedule in respect of the categories of goods mentioned in the Schedule are hereby remitted.

**SCHEDULE**

*Technical Assistance Projects.*

A. Materials supplied and equipment imported or purchased prior to clearance through the Customs—

- (i) which the Commissioner of Customs and Excise is satisfied are supplied for a technical assistance project pursuant to a technical assistance agreement to which the Government is a party which agreement provides for the exemption of such goods from import and suspended duties; or
- (ii) which the Minister for Finance is satisfied are provided for the furtherance of a technical assistance project, such goods to be specified by the Minister for Finance to the Commissioner of Customs and Excise.

B. *Technical Assistance Personnel.*

In respect of ~~exports~~ and other technical assistance personnel to be specified by the Minister for Finance to the Commissioner of Customs and Excise and who are not citizens of Tanzania or usually resident in Tanzania—

- 1 motor vehicle,
- 1 refrigerator,
- 1 air-conditioning unit,

which the Commissioner of Customs and Excise is satisfied is for the personal use of such personnel and which is imported or purchased prior to the clearance through Customs within 4 months of taking up residence in Tanzania PROVIDED that unless any such goods are—

- (i) re-exported on the termination of service of the personnel; or
- (ii) are disposed of to a similarly qualified person for his personal use; or
- (iii) remain in Tanzania for 2 years or longer;

then import duties shall be paid at the time of any subsequent disposal in accordance with the Customs Laws at the time of disposal.
