PRODUCE CESS ACT, 1962
(No. 53 OF 1962)

ORDER

Made under section 3

THE PRODUCE CESS (UFIPA DISTRICT COUNCIL) ORDER, 1965

1. This Order may be cited as the Produce Cess (Ufipa District Council) Order, 1965.

2. There shall be imposed on the produce specified in column one of the Schedule hereto which is bought or sold within or exported from the area of the jurisdiction of the Ufipa District Council a cess payable at the rate prescribed opposite thereto in column two of the said Schedule:

Provided that this Order shall apply only to the first sale or export of any produce and that cess shall not be payable on any subsequent sale or export of the same produce.

3. The cess imposed by paragraph 2 hereof shall be due and payable to the Ufipa District Council by the buyer or exporter at the time of sale or export:

Provided that where any produce to which this Order applies has been delivered for sale to a Co-operative Society registered under the Co-operative Societies Ordinance, the cess shall become due and payable by such Society at the time of payment of the proceeds of sale to it.

4.—(1) Where any produce to which this Order applies is sold at a market established by the Ufipa District Council the cess shall be paid to the Market Clerk who is hereby authorized to receive the same for and on behalf of the Ufipa District Council and to issue a receipt therefor.

(2) Where any produce to which this Order applies is exported or sold elsewhere than at a market or is delivered for sale to a Co-operative Society registered under the Co-operative Societies Ordinance, the exporter or Society, as the case may be, shall pay the cess to the Ufipa District Council through its Treasury.

5. No produce to which this Order applies and which has been bought or sold in a market established by the Ufipa District Council and on which any cess is due and remains unpaid shall be removed from such market until such cess has been paid in accordance with the provisions of this Order.
