FAUNA CONSERVATION

An Ordinance to make further and better provision for the conservation and control of wild animal life

[1ST OCTOBER, 1951]

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Fauna Conservation Ordinance.

2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires—  
“aerodrome” means any area of land or water designed, equipped, set apart or commonly used for affording facilities for the landing and departure of aircraft;

“African” means a person whose tribe is a tribe of Tanganyika or of Kenya, Uganda, Zanzibar, Zambia, Malawi, the Sudan, the Congo, Rwanda, Burundi or Portuguese East Africa and includes a Swahili;  
“aircraft” has the meaning assigned to it in the Colonial Air Navigation Order,\* 1949;

“animal” means any kind of vertebrate animal and the eggs and young thereof, other than domestic animals and, except as in sections 5 (1) and 17 expressly provided, fish;

“capture” includes any act immediately directed at the taking of any animal and the taking of nest, eggs or young;

“Chief Game Warden” means the officer for the time being in charge of the Game Division and includes his duly authorized representative;

“Commissioner of Customs” means the Commissioner of Customs appointed under section 12 (1) of the East Africa (High Commission) Order in Council,† 1947, and includes any customs officer;

“Controlled Area” means any area specified in the Seventh Schedule to this Ordinance in which the hunting of all animals is regulated by the written permission of the Chief Game Warden under section 11, but in which entry and residence are not controlled;

“Convention” means the International Convention relative to the preservation of fauna and flora in their natural state signed in London on the eighth day of November, 1933, which applies to the countries specified in the Twenty-third Schedule;

Note.—Section 21 (2) of the Ngorongoro Conservation Area Ordinance (Cap. 413) provides that the provisions of Cap. 302 shall take effect within the Conservation Area subject to the modifications, additions and amendments set out in the Third Schedule to Cap. 413.

“dangerous animal” means any animal specified in the Second Schedule to this Ordinance and any other animal which may be prescribed;

“export” means export from Tanganyika to any place outside Tanganyika.

“forest reserve” means an area declared to be a forest reserve under the provisions of the Forest Ordinance\*;

“game” and “game animal” means any animal specified in the First, Second or Third Schedules to this Ordinance and includes the eggs and young thereof;

“game bird” means any bird specified in the Third Schedule to this Ordinance;

“game licence” means any licence issued under the provisions of section 13 of this Ordinance;

“game reserve” means any area specified in the Sixth Schedule to this Ordinance in which the hunting of all animals is prohibited under section 5 and in which entry and residence are regulated;

“hide” means any form of man-made screen, fence, platform, pit or ambush intended to conceal a hunter;

“horn” includes rhinoceros horn;

“hours of darkness” means the period commencing half an hour after sunset on any day and ending half an hour before sunrise on the next day;

“hunting” includes any act immediately directed at the killing of any animal, but does not include the capture alive of any animal;

“ivory” means elephant ivory;

“licensing officer” means an Internal Revenue Officer, or any other person whom the Minister may by notice in the *Gazette* appoint to be a licensing officer for the purposes of this Ordinance;

“meat” includes the fat, blood and flesh of any animal, fresh, dried or otherwise preserved;

“mechanically propelled vehicle” means all vehicles, including watercraft and aircraft, which receive their motive power from internal combustion or steam or reaction or electrical propulsion;

“Minister” means the Minister for the time being responsible for matters relating to the conservation of fauna;

“officer of the Game Division” means a person for the time being holding an office in the Game Division set out in the Twenty-fourth Schedule to this Ordinance and, except where otherwise expressly provided, an Honorary Game Warden;

“Ordinance” includes regulations and orders issued thereunder;

“partial game reserve” means any area specified in the Eighth Schedule to this Ordinance in which the hunting of particular species of animals is prohibited or controlled under section 9 but in which entry and residence and the hunting of other species are not regulated;

“private land” means any freehold or leasehold land or land held under a right of occupancy;

“professional hunter” means any person who for hire or reward conducts hunting parties or assists any person or hunting party in the hunting of any animal;

“purchase” and “sell” include barter;

“road” means any highway and any other road to which the public has access and includes bridges over which a road passes;

“royal game” means any animal specified in the First Schedule to this Ordinance the hunting of which is prohibited throughout Tanganyika;

“trophy” means any animal, alive or dead, and any horn, ivory, tooth, tusk, bone, claw, hoof, skin, hair, feather, egg or other durable portion whatsoever of any animal, whether processed or not, provided that it is readily recognizable as a durable portion of an animal;

“trophy dealer” means a person who engages in the buying, selling or processing of trophies other than those obtained on a game licence or on a permit under section 19 issued to him;

“vermin” means any animal specified in the Fifth Schedule to this Ordinance and any animal declared to be vermin under section 35.

PART II

GAME RESERVES, CONTROLLED AREAS AND PARTIAL GAME RESERVES

A—Game Reserves

Game reserves

3. The areas described in the Sixth Schedule to this Ordinance are hereby declared to be game reserves.

4. The President may, by order published in the *Gazette*, add to, amend or replace all or any part of the Sixth Schedule.

Hunting in game reserves

5.—(1) Except as provided by section 17 (which relates to President’s licences) no person other than the Chief Game Warden, or such person as the Chief Game Warden may authorize to undertake scientific research or control measures, shall hunt any animal, including fish, in a game reserve.

Restriction on entry into and residence in game reserves

(2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

6.—(1) No person other than—

- (a) a public officer on duty within the reserve; or
- (b) a servant of a public officer on duty within the reserve; or
- (c) a person whose place of ordinary residence is within the reserve; or
- (d) a person travelling through the reserve along a road; or
- (e) a person engaged in a reserve upon forest or water works of any kind permitted by law,

shall enter or reside in a game reserve except by and in accordance with the written authority of the Chief Game Warden previously sought and obtained.

(2) Any person who contravenes any provision of this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

7.—(1) No person, other than those referred to in paragraphs (a) and (d) of section 6 and in section 17, shall be in possession of a firearm or bow or arrow in a game reserve without the written permission of the Chief Game Warden previously sought and obtained.

(2) Any person who contravenes any provision of this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

8.—(1) No person shall wilfully or negligently cause any bush or grass fire, or fell, cut, burn, injure or remove any standing tree, shrub, bush, sapling, seedling or any part thereof in a game reserve except by and in accordance with the written permission of the Chief Game Warden previously sought and obtained, and, if any part of the game reserve is included in a forest reserve, the Conservator of Forests or his duly authorized representative:

Protection of vegetation in game reserves

Provided that any person referred to in paragraph (c) or (e) of section 6 may without such permission fell trees for the purpose only of building dwellings for himself and his dependants and servants.

(2) Any person who contravenes any provision of this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

B—Controlled Areas and Partial Game Reserves

9. The areas described in the Seventh and Eighth Schedules to this Ordinance are hereby declared respectively to be controlled areas and partial game reserves.

10. The Minister may, by order published in the Gazette, add to, amend or replace all or any part of the Seventh or Eighth Schedules.

11.—(1) Except as provided by section 17 (which relates to President's licences) no person shall—

(a) in a controlled area hunt any animal therein without the written permission of the Chief Game Warden previously sought and obtained or otherwise than in accordance with the terms of such permission;

(b) in a partial game reserve, hunt, without the written permission of the Chief Game Warden previously sought and obtained or otherwise than in accordance with the terms of such permission, any animal specified in the Eighth Schedule the hunting of which is prohibited in that reserve.

(2) Any person who contravenes any provision of this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

(3) The Chief Game Warden shall not grant any permission under this section in respect of any controlled area situate within the Conservation Area established under the Ngorongoro Conservation Area Ordinance, within any range development area declared by or under the Range Development and Management Act, 1964, without the consent of the Conservator of the Ngorongoro Conservation Area or the Commission established for such range development area, as the case may be.

## PART III

## HUNTING OF ANIMALS

## A—Licences

**12.**—(1) No person shall hunt any animal shown in the Third Schedule to this Ordinance except under and in accordance with the conditions of a game licence issued to him under the provisions of section 13:

Provided that:—

- (i) no licence shall be necessary to hunt any such animal in any area in which it has been declared to be vermin under the provisions of section 35;
- (ii) persons who are members of the tribes specified in the Twenty-second Schedule to this Ordinance shall be permitted to hunt without a licence those animals which may be hunted by the holder of a general game licence;
- (iii) any other person or class of persons may be permitted by the Minister to hunt any such animal without a licence.

(2) Nothing in subsection (1) of this section or the proviso thereto shall be construed as derogating from any other obligation imposed upon any person by or under this Ordinance.

(3) Any person who contravenes any provision of subsection (1) of this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

(4) The Minister may, by order published in the *Gazette*, and to, amend or replace all or any part of the Third Schedule either in respect of the whole of Tanganyika or in respect of specified areas.

**13.**—(1) Game licences may be issued by any licensing officer upon application made in writing in the form shown in the Ninth Schedule:

Provided that the licensing officer before issuing the licence may require the applicant to appear before him in person and produce for his inspection his arms licence.

(2) Game licences shall be of the following kinds:—

- (a) a general game licence, in the form shown in the Tenth Schedule, which shall entitle the holder to hunt animals of the kind and number specified in the first and second columns of Part A of the Third Schedule, and birds of the kind and number permitted by a bird licence;
- (b) a supplementary game licence, in the form shown in the Eleventh Schedule, which shall entitle the holder to hunt animals of the kind and number specified therein in accordance with the first and third columns of Part A of the Third Schedule and which shall be issued only to the holder of a general game licence in accordance with the following conditions:—
  - (i) subject to the provisions of sub-paragraph (ii) of this paragraph, any number of supplementary game licences may be issued to one individual during the currency of the general

game licence in relation to which it is issued, to hunt any or all of the species shown in the first column of Part A of the Third Schedule;

- (ii) the maximum number of each species shown in the first column of Part A of the Third Schedule which may be hunted during the period of validity of the supplementary game licence, irrespective of the number of licences issued, shall not exceed the numbers corresponding to such species shown in the third column of the said Part;
- (c) a minor game licence, in the prescribed form, which shall entitle the holder to hunt animals of the kind and numbers specified in respect of a minor game licence in the Third Schedule;
- (d) a bird licence, in the form shown in the Twelfth Schedule, which shall entitle the holder to hunt birds of the kind and number specified in the first and second columns of Part B of the Third Schedule;
- (e) an elephant licence, in the prescribed form, which shall entitle the holder to hunt not more than five elephants:

Provided that if during the currency of an elephant licence the holder kills elephants having tusks weighing in the aggregate more than three hundred pounds avoirdupois, exclusive of any tusks which may be Government trophies under section 47, such licence shall thereupon expire:

Provided further that no second or subsequent elephant licence shall be issued to any person who has previously held an elephant licence until after the expiry of one year from the date of issue of the elephant licence last issued to such person;

And provided further that no elephant licence shall be issued after the date of coming into operation of the Fauna Conservation Ordinance (Amendment) Act, 1963;

- (f) notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1) of this section, a local game licence in the prescribed form may be issued to Africans by an authority prescribed for the purposes of this paragraph. A local game licence shall entitle the holder to hunt, by means of a weapon other than a breech-loading weapon, such of the animals which may be hunted on a general game licence in such numbers and in such areas as may be approved by the Minister in writing.

(3) A general game licence, a minor game licence, a bird licence and, subject to the provisions of paragraph (e) of the preceding subsection, an elephant licence, shall be valid for one year from the date on which they are issued, and a supplementary game licence shall be valid only during the currency of the general game licence in relation to which it is issued.

(4) A game licence shall not be transferable and any purported transfer of a game licence shall be void.

(5) The fees payable in respect of game licences, other than a supplementary game licence and a local game licence, shall be those shown in the Fifteenth Schedule to this Ordinance.

(6) The fees payable in respect of each animal specified on a supplementary game licence shall be those specified in the fourth column of Part A of the Third Schedule to this Ordinance.

(7) Where the authority prescribed for the purposes of paragraph (f) of subsection (2) of this section is a native authority or an authority established under the Local Government Ordinance, the fees payable in respect of local game licences issued by such authority shall be prescribed by rules under the Native Authority Ordinance or by by-laws under the Local Government Ordinance, as the case may be, and where the Minister prescribes any other person or body as an authority for the purposes of that paragraph, he himself shall prescribe the fees.

(8) The Minister may, by order published in the *Gazette*, add to, amend or replace all or any part of the Fifteenth Schedule either in respect of the whole of Tanganyika or in respect of specified areas.

(9) A game licence, including a local game licence, lawfully issued prior to the date on which the Fauna Conservation (Amendment) Ordinance, 1960,\* came into operation shall be and remain a valid game licence for the unexpired portion of the period for which it was issued, or if no such period is specified in the licence, for the unexpired portion of a period of one year from the date upon which it was issued.

(10) No elephant licence shall be issued to the holder of a current supplementary licence for elephant nor shall a supplementary licence for elephant be issued to the holder of a current elephant licence.

(11) No general game licence or minor game licence shall be issued to a person who is the holder of a current local game licence.

(12) A general game licence shall not be issued to any person who is the holder of a current minor game licence, but the holder of a current minor game licence may surrender his licence at any time during the period of its validity and may be issued with a general game licence upon payment of the balance of the prescribed fee therefor and any game killed under the minor game licence shall be deemed to have been killed under the general game licence which shall be endorsed accordingly by the licensing officer.

(13) A minor game licence shall not be issued to any person who is the holder of a current general game licence.

(14) Any person to whom a game licence, other than a supplementary game licence, has been issued under the provisions of subsection (2) of this section, who wilfully obtains a further licence of the same kind for a period during which, or part of which, such previous licence is current, or who knowingly obtains a licence to which he is not entitled under the provisions of subsections (10), (11), (12) and (13) of this section, shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

14.—(1) No person shall act as a professional hunter unless he is in possession of a valid professional hunter's licence:

Provided that this section shall not apply to Africans, unless the Chief Game Warden in the case of any person or persons at any time otherwise directs.

(2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

15.—(1) A professional hunter's licence, in the form shown in the Thirteenth Schedule, may be issued by the Chief Game Warden in his discretion to any person upon application made in writing on the form shown in the Ninth Schedule, and shall entitle the holder to exercise the functions of a professional hunter as defined in section 2 of this Ordinance.

(2) A professional hunter's licence shall be valid for one year from the date on which it is issued.

(3) No person shall transfer a professional hunter's licence to any other person, and no person except the person to whom it is issued shall make use of a professional hunter's licence. Any person who contravenes any provision of this subsection shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

(4) The fee payable in respect of a professional hunter's licence shall be that specified in the Fifteenth Schedule to this Ordinance.

16. A resident's licence shall be issued only to a person who—

- (a) normally resides in Tanganyika; or
- (b) is an officer employed in the public service of Uganda or Kenya; or
- (c) is an officer on the active list of the Armed Forces of the Republic.

Issue of residents' licences

17.—(1) Notwithstanding the other provisions of this Part, it shall be lawful for the Chief Game Warden, upon such conditions as he may deem fit, with or without a fee, to grant to any person a licence, to be called a President's licence, which shall entitle the holder to hunt or photograph the animals, including fish, specified therein for any of the following purposes:—

- (a) scientific research and museums;
- (b) complimentary purposes;
- (c) educational purposes;
- (d) the supply of food in cases of emergency where no other adequate food supply is available.

(2) A President's licence issued for any of the purposes mentioned in paragraphs (a), (c) or (d) of subsection (1) of this section may authorize the hunting or photography of any animal, including fish, whether protected by any other provision of this Part or not, and whether in a game reserve or not.

(3) The Chief Game Warden may at any time without assigning any reason cancel or suspend any licence issued under this section.

18.—(1) No person other than persons of the tribes specified in the Twenty-second Schedule shall hunt any animal which is not specified in any Schedule to this Ordinance except under and in accordance with a permit issued under section 19 of this Ordinance.

Unscheduled animals may not be hunted without a permit

(2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

19.—(1) The Chief Game Warden may—

- (a) issue permits for the killing or capture of animals, whether or not specified in any Schedule to this Ordinance, for the purposes *inter alia* of—
  - (i) providing specimens for zoological gardens and similar institutions;
  - (ii) the proper regulation of commercial development connected with wild life, including the crocodile industry;
  - (iii) the control of animals declared to be vermin the hunting of which without a permit is prohibited under section 35 (4) hereof; and
  - (iv) control of animal diseases;
- (b) impose in any permit such conditions as to methods of hunting, capture, care and handling during and after capture, stabling, feeding and exporting of any animals as he may think fit;
- (c) direct and charge the fees or royalties which shall be payable in respect of any animals or the products or trophies of any animals killed or captured under any permit;
- (d) declare in any permit the area or areas in which such permit shall be valid.

(2) Any person who commits any breach of the conditions of any permit issued hereunder shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

(3) No person shall capture any animal except under and in accordance with the conditions of a permit issued to him under the provisions of subsection (1) of this section. Any person who contravenes the provisions of this subsection shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

20.—(1) Without assigning any reason therefor the Chief Game Warden or any licensing officer may, if he deem fit, refuse to issue any licence, or copy of any licence, or any permit, permission or authority under this Ordinance, and any licensing officer or officer of the Game Division may cancel or suspend any licence, permit, permission or authority issued by the Chief Game Warden or a licensing officer under this Ordinance, and in any case in which he shall have done so he shall forthwith report the fact to the Chief Game Warden and to the licensing officer:

Provided that an Honorary Game Warden may not cancel any licence.

(2) Any person aggrieved by any order under subsection (1) of this section may ask that the matter be referred to the Minister, whose decision shall be final.

(3) For the purposes of this section, an authority prescribed for the purposes of paragraph (f) of subsection (2) of section 13 of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be a licensing officer in respect of local game licences.

Disqualification from grant of licence

21.—(1) Any person who has been convicted of an offence against this Ordinance or any ordinance repealed by this Ordinance or any existing or repealed Game Ordinance of Kenya, Uganda or Zambia,

or in respect of whom any licence under this Ordinance has been cancelled or suspended, or who at any time has been refused any licence under this Ordinance, shall be disqualified from the grant of any licence under this Ordinance, unless and until in any case other than that of a conviction under this Ordinance the Chief Game Warden otherwise directs.

In the case of any conviction under this Ordinance, the period of disqualification shall be that specified in section 53 (4) of this Ordinance.

(2) Any person who fails to inform the Chief Game Warden or a licensing officer at the time of his application for any licence under this Ordinance of the fact that he has been or is disqualified from possessing or that he has at any time been refused any licence under this Ordinance or who makes a false declaration in or in connection with any application for any licence under this Ordinance shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

22.—(1) No licence or permit shall be issued under this Ordinance to any applicant for such licence or permit who is not in lawful possession of a weapon suitable for the hunting of any animal which such licence or permit would entitle the applicant to hunt:

Provided that nothing in this subsection shall apply to a trophy dealer's licence.

(2) The Chief Game Warden may direct what weapons, classes of weapons or projectiles or classes of projectiles may be deemed suitable for the hunting of particular species of animals.

(3) Where the Chief Game Warden has directed that a particular weapon or projectile or a particular class of weapon or projectile shall be deemed to be suitable for the hunting of particular species of animals, any person who hunts any animal of any such species by means of any weapon or any projectile other than a weapon or projectile deemed to be suitable therefor shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

23.—(1) (a) Any person to whom there has been issued any licence, permit, permission or authority in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance, shall carry such licence, permit, permission or authority with him when exercising the rights thereby conferred.

(b) The holder of any licence, permit, permission or authority issued to him in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance, other than a bird licence or a local game licence, shall record in English in indelible writing in the space provided thereon details of all animals, other than game birds, killed by him in the exercise of the rights thereby conferred, and all other details required on the reverse thereof. No animal so killed, nor any part thereof, shall be removed from the place where such animal fell before all such details have been so recorded.

(c) The holder of a local game licence shall record or cause to be recorded in such manner as may be prescribed details of all animals, other than game birds, killed by him within any controlled area in

the exercise of the rights thereby conferred, and may remove any such animal or any part thereof to such place as may be necessary for such details so to be recorded.

(2) Not later than fifteen days after the expiry of any licence other than a bird licence or a local game licence or before leaving Tanganyika or area for which such licence is valid if he leaves before such expiry, the holder shall surrender such licence to any licensing officer or officer of the Game Division and shall sign a declaration certifying the accuracy of the record of game killed.

(3) Any person who contravenes any provision of this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

**24.—(1)** Except as provided in section 17 the animals specified in the First Schedule to this Ordinance shall not be hunted throughout Tanganyika by any person and shall be known as royal game.

(2) The Minister may at any time add to, amend or replace all or any part of the First Schedule.

(3) In addition to the provisions of sections 3, 4, 5 and 9 of this Ordinance, and of subsections (1) and (2) of this section, the Minister may, by order published in the *Gazette*, prohibit or control the hunting or photography of any animal either generally or during a specified period and either throughout Tanganyika or in any specified area thereof. Such order may apply to all animals within the area specified or to any animal or class of animals specified in the order.

(4) Any person who contravenes any provision of this section or fails to comply with any order made hereunder shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

**27.—(1)** Nothing in this Ordinance shall make it an offence to kill or injure any animal in defence of human life or in defence of property, or for the owner or occupier of such property or for any person

dependant on or employed by such owner or occupier to drive out or destroy any animal found on such property by any means whatsoever:

Provided that—

- (i) this section shall not apply to the killing or injury of an animal in self defence if the behaviour of the animal necessitating such killing or injury is the result of molestation or deliberate provocation by or with the knowledge and consent of the person killing or injuring such animal;
- (ii) nothing in this section shall be deemed to exonerate any person who, when such defence became necessary, was committing an act in contravention of any provision of this Ordinance;
- (iii) nothing in this section shall authorize the use of stakes in pitfalls or of any similar device which is likely to result in undue cruelty to animals or to endanger human life;
- (iv) nothing in this section shall be deemed to authorize the owner or occupier of any property marching with a game reserve to shoot any animal within such reserve without the permission of the Chief Game Warden previously sought and obtained.

(2) The meat of any animal lawfully killed in defence of property under this section may be utilized by the owner or occupier of such property for consumption by himself, his dependants and employees.

(3) Nothing in this section shall be deemed to authorize the sale or barter of the meat of any animal killed in defence of property.

**28.**—(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Ordinance, an administrative officer or an officer of the Game Division may kill or authorize the killing of any animal by any method if he considers it necessary in the interests of public safety or the protection of property. Destruction of animals

(2) A person killing such animal may with the consent of the Chief Game Warden retain any trophy under such conditions including payment as the Chief Game Warden shall think fit.

(3) The Chief Game Warden may direct that a reward shall be paid to the person killing any animal authorized under subsection (1) of this section.

**29.** Any person who shall wound an animal and fail to use all reasonable endeavours to kill it at the earliest opportunity shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance: Cruelty prohibited

(2) Such report shall state what animal has been wounded, the time, date and place of the wounding, the type of wound or wounds inflicted, what efforts were made to kill the animal after it had been wounded, when and where the animal was finally lost, together with any other information that might help to locate and identify it.

(3) Any person who wounds and fails to kill any dangerous animal and who fails to report at the earliest possible moment the loss of such animal in the manner required by this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

(8) No person shall use for the purpose of hunting any animal any device capable of reducing or designed to reduce the sound made by the discharge of any firearm.

(9) No person shall use any other method of hunting which may be prescribed as unlawful.

(10) No person shall hunt any game animal not being a hippopotamus, sitatunga, otter or a game bird within five hundred yards of any surface water or salt lick to which the game animals resort.

(11) The provisions of this section shall not apply to the hunting of vermin.

(12) Any person who contravenes any provisions of this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

35.—(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 12, the Chief Game Warden may, by order, declare any animal to be vermin, either generally or in any specified area, and it shall not be necessary to hold a game licence to hunt any such animal in such area. Vermin 1965-460

#### PART IV

##### TROPHIES (INCLUDING LIVE ANIMALS)

37.—(1) No person shall manufacture articles from trophies for sale or carry on the business of a trophy dealer except under and in accordance with a trophy dealer's licence issued to him under the provisions of this Part. Manufacture of and dealing in trophies prohibited without a trophy dealer's licence

(2) Any person who contravenes any provision of this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

Provided that nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to permit any person to export any living animal from Tanganyika unless a President's licence has been granted under subsection (1) of section 17 or a Chief Game Warden's permit has been issued under section 19 in respect of such animal.

(4) No person shall, except by and in accordance with the permission of the Chief Game Warden previously sought and obtained, import any living animal.

(5) No person shall import any trophy from any country to which the Convention applies unless he produces the same at the time of importation to the Commissioner of Customs together with a certificate of lawful export in respect of the trophy from such country. Any trophy imported in contravention of this provision may be confiscated and forfeited to the Government.

(6) No person shall import any trophy from any country to which the Convention does not apply unless he produces the same at the time of importation to the Commissioner of Customs together with such evidence as the latter may require to satisfy himself that it has been lawfully exported from the country of origin.

(7) No person shall import or export any trophy other than through one of the approved customs posts specified in the Eighteenth Schedule to this Ordinance.

(8) Any person who contravenes any provision of subsections (2), (3), (4), (5), (6) or (7) of this section shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

41.—(1) No person shall sell or otherwise dispose of or offer for sale or other disposal the skin or any part of the skin of any game animal to which this section applies unless he is in possession of a certificate of ownership thereof issued under subsection (1) of section 40 and upon the sale or disposal of any such skin the person selling or disposing of the same shall deliver such certificate to the person buying or receiving the same.

43.—(1) The officer to whom any ivory or rhinoceros horn is produced under the provisions of section 42, if satisfied after such inquiry as he may consider necessary that the ivory or rhinoceros horn has been lawfully obtained, shall weigh the same and cause it to be marked with the appropriate distinctive mark as set out in the Nineteenth Schedule and a number, shall record such weight, number, owner's

## PART VI

### GOVERNMENT TROPHIES

47.—(1) The following are Government trophies and, subject to the provisions of subsection (2) of this section, are the property of the Government, that is to say:—

- (a) any game animal which has been killed or captured without a licence and the trophy of any such animal;
- (b) any game animal found dead and the trophy of any such animal or any part of any game animal which is found;
- (c) any animal killed or captured in contravention of any of the provisions of this Ordinance and the trophy of any such animal;
- (d) any trophy in respect of which a breach of the provisions of this Ordinance has been committed;
- (e) any animal or trophy which is in the possession of any person and which may be reasonably suspected of having been stolen or unlawfully obtained, and in respect of which such person is unable to give an account to the satisfaction of the Game Warden or of any other person authorized by him in that behalf as to how he came by the same;

(f) any elephant tusks weighing less than twenty-two pounds the pair, or eleven pounds in the case of an elephant having a single tusk, or such other weight as may be prescribed in respect of the whole of Tanganyika or of any particular area;

(g) any other animal or trophy which may be prescribed.

(2) Any trophy found or obtained in a national park declared under the provisions of section 3 of the National Parks Ordinance\* shall be the property of the Trustees of such national park. Cap. 253\*

## PART VII

### PREVENTION AND DETECTION OF OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

51.—(1) If any administrative officer or any officer of the Game Division or any police officer not below the rank of inspector has reasonable grounds for believing that any person has committed an offence against this Ordinance he may— Powers of search

(a) require any such person to produce for his inspection any animal, meat, trophy or weapon in his possession or any licence or other document issued to him or required to be kept by him under the provisions of this Ordinance or the Arms and Ammunition Ordinance or any order or regulation made thereunder; Cap. 223

(b) save in a municipality or township enter and search any land, building, tent, vehicle, aeroplane or boat, in the occupation or use of such person, and open and search any baggage or other thing in his possession:

Provided that no dwelling-house shall be entered without a warrant except in the presence of two independent witnesses;

(c) seize any animal, meat, trophy or weapon in the possession of any person and, unless he is satisfied that such person will appear and answer any charge which may be preferred against him, arrest and detain him.

(2) It shall be lawful for any officer of the Game Division or any police officer not below the rank of inspector at all reasonable times to enter the licensed premises of any trophy dealer and to inspect the records which are required to be kept under the provisions of section 39 of this Ordinance.

(3) Any person detained or things seized under the foregoing powers shall be taken as soon as possible before a court of competent jurisdiction to be dealt with according to law.

(4) It shall be lawful for any officer of the Game Division, any person in the regular employment of the Game Division either in uniform or carrying written confirmation of his authority or any administrative officer to stop and detain any person whom he sees doing, or suspects of having done, any act for which a licence, permit, permission or authority is required under the provisions of this Ordinance for the purpose of requiring such person to produce the same or to allow any vehicle of his to be searched.

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Any person who fails to produce his licence, permit, permission or authority when ordered to do so, or fails to stop when ordered or signalled to do so, or fails to allow any vehicle of his to be searched, shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance and may be arrested without a warrant unless he furnishes in writing his name and address and otherwise satisfies the officer or employee of the Game Division or administrative officer that he will duly answer any summons or other proceedings which may be taken against him.

(5) It shall be lawful for any officer of the Game Division, any person in the regular employment of the Game Division either in uniform or carrying written confirmation of his authority, or any administrative officer to order any person stopped or arrested by him to submit in writing his name and address and the details of any game licence issued to him.

(6) If the driver of any vehicle fails to stop when ordered or signalled to do so there shall be unless the contrary appear a presumption that the person in whose name the said vehicle was registered was such driver and in any proceedings the onus of proving the contrary shall rest upon such person.

(7) Any person who wilfully obstructs any person in the exercise of powers conferred by this section or, without reasonable excuse, fails to give any information or produce anything which under the powers conferred by this section he is required to give or to produce, shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

(3) Every person so required to stop or any passenger on such vehicle shall allow the officer or uniformed employee of the Game Division or any administrative officer to perform the approved inspection set out in a notice displayed at the point where the barrier is erected.

(4) Any person who fails to comply with any of the foregoing provisions of this section, or who fails to comply with any lawful order given by an officer or uniformed employee of the Game Division or any administrative officer shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance.

(4) Any person convicted of any offence against this Ordinance shall thereby be disqualified from holding any licence issued under the provisions of this Ordinance for such period, whether longer or shorter than three years, as the Chief Game Warden may determine, or, in the absence of such determination, for a period of three years from the date of such conviction.

(5) Anything forfeited to the Government under this section shall, for the purpose of the disposal thereof, be deemed to be a Government trophy.

## PART VIII

### GENERAL

57.—(1) The Chief Game Warden may appoint fit and proper persons to be Honorary Game Wardens for the purpose of assisting in the carrying out of the provisions of this Ordinance. Honorary Game Wardens

(2) Except as may be otherwise herein provided, an Honorary Game Warden shall have all the powers conferred by this Ordinance upon an officer of the Game Division and shall hold office for a period of three years unless the appointment be sooner revoked.

*Boundaries.*—From the summit of Kinondu Hill the boundary follows a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the highest point in the Maji ya Kununua Hills; thence in an easterly direction to the summit of Ndea Hill; thence in a north-easterly direction through the summit of Ngurunga (Ndea Ndogo) Hill to the Kenya boundary; thence south-eastwards along the Kenya-Tanganyika boundary to a point due north of Gerevi Hill; thence in a straight line due south through Gerevi Hill to the Uмба River; thence following the south bank of the Uмба River upstream (westwards) to a beacon on the said bank approximately due south of Mazunya Hill and approximately one and a half miles east of the confluence of the Uмба and Mbaramu Rivers; thence in a straight line northwards to the summit of Mazunya Hill, thence in a straight line in a north-westerly direction to the summit of Kigongojiwa-Kubwa Ridge; thence in a straight line in a westerly direction to Musambura water hole; thence in a westerly direction to the eastern summit of Karambatu Hill; thence in a south-westerly direction to the summit of Mabili (Usambaa) Hill; thence in a north-westerly direction to the Kashugu water hole which is situated about two miles north of Mabili (Upare) Hill; thence in a straight line in a north-westerly direction to the summit of Masanzali Hill; thence on a magnetic bearing of approximately 310 degrees to a beacon situated on the south bank of the Kisiwani River; thence following the south bank of the Kisiwani River upstream to its second crossing of the main Kihurio-Same road near the Kisiwani P.W.D. road camp; thence in a north-easterly direction to the summit of Mwetakomboke Hill; thence in a north-westerly direction to the summit of Manola Hill; thence in a south-westerly direction along a cut trace towards Kwizu Hill as far as the main Kihurio-Same road; thence in a north-westerly direction following the south side of the said road to a beacon situated at the junction of the Kihurio-Same road with the Same-Ndea track; thence in a straight line in a northerly direction to the summit of Zange Hill; thence northwards along the watershed through Igiri Hill and Bumbuli Hill to the summit of Kinondu Hill, the point of commencement.

2. *The Mount Meru Game Reserve in the Arusha District.*

The mountain mass of Meru, including the Engurdoto Crater, bounded by the lower margin of the dense forest belt, and including any area lying within the line of beacons marking the forest reserve.

3. *The Kilimanjaro Game Reserve in the Moshi District.*

All that area of land within the Kilimanjaro Forest Reserve boundaries which are described in Government Notice No. 227 of 1940 and delineated in red on Survey Division Plan No. A.41, No. Jb52A and No. Jb52B.

4. *The Rungwa River Game Reserve in the Manyoni, Iringa, Mbeya and Chunya Districts.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at mile 83 from Itigi on the Lupa-Itigi Road the boundary follows a north-easterly direction along the old Kiwele-Manyoni track to Ushilo; thence south-eastwards along the Kikula-Maswaga footpath (the "Barabara ya Zambi") to the crossing of the Pingo stream; thence downstream along the left bank of the said stream eastwards to its confluence with the Makasumbi River; thence downstream along the left bank of the said river to its confluence with the Njombe River; thence in a south-south-easterly direction along a cut trace to a beacon near the village of Mkwambi; thence in a south-easterly direction along a cut trace to a beacon on the Lufugwa River near the village of Nyamasitu; thence in a southerly direction along a cut trace to a beacon near the village of Magaga on the left bank of the Great Ruaha River; thence following the left bank of the Great Ruaha River upstream to its confluence with the Njakapembe River; thence upstream along the Njakapembe River to its source; thence in a westerly direction through the summit of Makangwe Hill to the source of the Njombe River; thence downstream along the left bank of the Njombe River to its confluence with the Utambi River; thence along the right bank of the said river northwards till it cuts the Isambwa path; thence westwards along the said path to the crossing of the Mkonongo River; thence along the left bank of the said river northwards to its confluence with the Rungwa River; thence along the left bank of the said river westwards to the Lupa-Itigi Road; thence northwards along the western border of the Lupa-Itigi Road reserve to mile 83, the point of commencement.

5. *The Gombe Stream Game Reserve in the Kigoma and Kasulu Districts.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at a beacon on the shore of Lake Tanganyika at Ras Kasinga the boundary follows a line to a beacon on Katunda Hill; thence following the watershed in a northerly direction to a cairn on Karakihuma Mountain; thence again following the watershed in a northerly direction through cairns on the summits of Mlundi and Milenda Kabanda Mountains to a cairn on the summit of Kichwa Cha Fisi Mountain; thence in a straight line in a westerly direction to a cairn approximately fifty yards south of Mwangongo village on the shore of Lake Tanganyika; thence in a southerly direction along the Lake shore to a cairn on Ras Kasinga, the point of commencement.

6. *The Katevi Plain Game Reserve in the Mpanda District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at the crossing of the Mpanda-Sumbawanga road over the Katuma river at Sitalike the boundary follows the left (east) bank of the Katuma river in a southerly direction for approximately four miles to a beacon situated on the left bank of the said river; thence in an easterly direction along a cleared and beacons line to a beacon situated beside the Sikitiko-Ikuu road south of its intersection with the Sitalike-Kapapa road; thence in a south-westerly direction following the east side of the Sikitiko-Ikuu road to a beacon placed beside the said road at its intersection with the track to Luwale camp (approximately five miles north of the Katuma river causeway at Ikuu); thence following a cleared and beacons line in a south-easterly direction to the Fulami river; thence following a cleared and beacons line in a southerly direction for approximately six miles; thence following a cleared and beacons line in a westerly direction to Kampembwe situated at the junction of the Nkamba-Nkumgwe road with the Mpanda-Sumbawanga main road; thence in a northerly direction to a beacon situated at the foot of the Malimba Hill; thence in an easterly direction along a cleared and beacons line to the crossing of the Mpanda-Sumbawanga road over the Katuma river at Sitalike, which is the point of commencement:

Provided that nothing in this Schedule shall be deemed to prohibit bee-keeping in that portion of the Katavi Plain Reserve that lies to the east of the Sikitiko-Ikuu-Usevy road by persons in exercise of native customary rights.

7. *The Selous Game Reserve in the Morogoro, Rufiji, Nachingwea, Ulanga and Kilosa Districts.*

## SEVENTH SCHEDULE

## CONTROLLED AREAS

## (Section 9)

The hunting of all animals in the areas specified in this Schedule is prohibited except in accordance with the written permission of the Chief Game Warden, and except in accordance with any conditions which may be set forth in such permission:

1. *Handeni Controlled Area, Handeni District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at the point where the Korogwe-Handeni Kibaya Motor Road cuts the northern boundary of the Handeni District, the boundary follows this road to the point where it cuts the western boundary of Handeni District, thence it follows a northerly then easterly direction along the Handeni District boundary to the point of commencement.

2. *Ruvu River Controlled Area, Pare and Masai Districts.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at the junction of the Moshi-Naberera road with the Arusha Chini track at Lolbene the boundary follows the said track in a north-easterly direction to a sign board south-south-east of Lelatema triangulation beacon; thence due east along a cleared and beaconsed line to the Ruvu (Pangani) river; thence following the left (east) bank of the said river downstream (south) to Keria; thence in a north-easterly direction along the Keria-Lembeni motor-track to its junction with the Moshi-Tanga railway line, thence south along the said railway line to Kilometre 260/5; thence in a south-westerly direction to the summit of Kitamuri hill; thence in a south-easterly direction to the summit of Masandari hill; thence due east to the Moshi-Tanga railway line; thence following the said railway line southwards to Kilometre 190; thence due west to the Ruvu river; thence following the left (east) bank of the Ruvu river upstream (north-west) to the Ruvu Rimiti ford; thence following the Ruvu-Rimiti-Naberera motor-track north-westwards to Naberera; thence following the Naberera-Moshi motor road northwards to its junction with the Arusha Chini motor-track at Lolbene, the point of commencement.

3. *Lake Manka Controlled Area, Lushoto District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at the village of Langata on the Mkomazi River the boundary follows the Mkomazi River downstream to the village of Mtindilo; thence in a south-westerly direction to the summit of Kitumbatu Hill; thence in a northerly direction following the top of the watershed between the Ruvu (or Pangani) and Mkomazi Rivers to a point due west of the village of Langata; thence due east to the village of Langata which is the point of commencement:

Provided that nothing in this Schedule shall be deemed to prohibit fishing in the Lake Manka Controlled Area by persons in exercise of native customary rights.

4. *Sanya Plains—Lelatema Mountains Controlled Area, Moshi and Masai Districts.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at a beacon placed on the western boundary of the Arusha and Moshi Districts at a point approximately two miles north of the main Arusha-Moshi road, the boundary follows a beaconsed line due east to the Sanya river; thence following the left (east) bank of the Sanya river downstream (south) to its point of confluence with the Kikuletwa river; thence following the left (north) bank of the Kikuletwa river downstream (eastwards) to the motor-track at the Limeworks; thence following the said motor-track eastwards and southwards to its junction with the Arusha Chini-Lolbene motor-track, thence following the Arusha Chini-Lolbene motor-track south-westwards and westwards to its junction with the Moshi-Naberera road at Lolbene; thence due west along a cleared and beaconsed line to a beacon sited at a point two miles due west from the said road; thence in a northerly direction along a cleared and beaconsed line to the point of intersection of the Moshi-Arusha inter-district boundary with the Kikuletwa river; thence following the said inter-district boundary in a northerly direction to the beacon erected on it two miles north of the main Arusha-Moshi road which is the point of commencement.

5. *Meserani Dam Controlled Area, Masai District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of three miles from the centre of the retaining wall of the Meserani Dam in the Masai District.

6. *Ngudu Dam Controlled Area, Kwimba District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Ngudu Dam in the Kwimba District.

7. *Old Shinyanga Dam Controlled Area, Shinyanga District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Old Shinyanga Dam in the Shinyanga District.

8. Deleted.

9. *Tinde Dam Controlled Area, Shinyanga District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Tinde Dam in the Shinyanga District.

10. *Williamson Diamond Mine Controlled Area, Shinyanga District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of three miles from the centre of the retaining wall of the Williamson Diamond Mine Dam in the Shinyanga District.

11. Deleted.

12. *Bukoba Controlled Area, Bukoba District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of two miles from the Bukoba Boma:

Provided that nothing in this Schedule shall be deemed to prohibit fishing in the Bukoba Controlled Area.

13. *Kongwa Controlled Area, Kongwa and Masai Districts.*

*Boundaries.*—All land in the Kongwa District in the occupation of the Overseas Food Corporation, together with that area around Njogi Mountain whose boundary runs through the summit of Laikala Hill in a straight line in a south-easterly direction to the summit of Masanyete Hill in a straight line in a north-easterly direction along the cleared trace to the water-hole 4169 on the Mlali-Njogi Road; thence northwards along the Mlali-Njogi Road to a point due west of Musere Hill; thence in a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the summit of point 5378; thence in a straight line in a north-westerly direction to the summit of point 4235; thence in a straight line in a westerly direction to the summit of Noomai Hill; thence in a straight line in a west-north-westerly direction to the summit of Hogoro Hill; then along the ridge of Hogoro Hill in a westerly direction to its junction with the main Hogoro-Kongwa Road; thence southwards along the said road to its junction with the boundary of the Overseas Food Corporation's lands.

14. *Nzega Dam Controlled Area, Nzega District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Nzega Dam in the Nzega District.

15. *Isaka Dam Controlled Area, Kahama District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Isaka Dam in the Kahama District.

16. *Kahama Dam Controlled Area, Kahama District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Kahama Dam in the Kahama District.

17. *Kazima Dam Controlled Area, Tabora District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Kazima Dam in the Tabora District.

18. *Kiloleni Dam Controlled Area, Tabora District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Kiloleni Dam in the Tabora District.

19. *Kihirimira Pool Controlled Area, Kilwa District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area lying within one mile of the Kihirimira Pool in the Kilwa District, which is situated on the left bank of the Liwale River and about two miles above its confluence with the Matandu River.

20. *Songea District Controlled Area, Songea District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area lying within the boundaries of the Songea District, in the Southern Province, for a period of five years from the thirtieth day of September, 1946.

21. *Lihogosa Controlled Area, Njombe District.*

The area lying within two miles of the high water mark of the Lihogosa Swamp in the Njombe District.

22. *The Lake Rukwa Controlled Area, Mbeya, Ufipa, Mpanda and Chunya Districts.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at the village of Nakachese on the south shore of Lake Rukwa the boundary shall follow the track in a north-westerly direction to Ilala on the Momba River; thence in a north-westerly direction upstream along the northern bank of the Momba River to a beaconed point near Sangama on the Sangama-Ntumba track; thence following the eastern side of the said track to a beaconed point at Ntumba; thence along the eastern side of the road running from Ntumba-Sakalilo-Milepa-Luipa-Usia-past Muse; thence to a beaconed point near the causeway; thence along the southern side of the track to Soda and on to Kaumbaliza Camp and Kasekela Camp to Maji ya Moto; thence along the north side of the motor road in an easterly direction to the village of Rungwa West; thence along the east bank of the Rungwa River upstream to the top of the escarpment bordering the east side of the Rukwa Valley; thence in a south-easterly direction along the top of the said escarpment as far as the Lago River; thence in a south-westerly direction along the east bank of the said river to the shore of Lake Rukwa; thence in a south-easterly direction along the high water mark of the said lake to the mouth of the Mtaga River; thence in a straight line in a southerly direction to Nakachese, the point of commencement.

23. *Ulaya Dam Controlled Area, Nzega District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Ulaya Dam in the Nzega District.

24. *Itobo Dam Controlled Area, Nzega District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Itobo Dam in the Nzega District.

25. *Mwakulu Dam Controlled Area, Nzega District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Mwakulu Dam in the Nzega District.

26. *Igurubi Dam Controlled Area, Nzega District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Igurubi Dam in the Nzega District.

27. *Mwanhala Dam Controlled Area, Nzega District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Mwanhala Dam in the Nzega District.

28. *Kalangali Dam Controlled Area, Nzega District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Kalangali Dam in the Nzega District.

29. *Puge Dam Controlled Area, Nzega District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Puge Dam in the Nzega District.

30. *Mwandu Dam Controlled Area, Kwimba District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Mwandu Dam in the Kwimba District.

31. *Kadeshi Dam Controlled Area, Kwimba District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Kadeshi Dam in the Kwimba District.

32. *Ibindo Dam Controlled Area, Kwimba District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Ibindo Dam in the Kwimba District.

33. *Nyamilama Dam Controlled Area, Kwimba District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Nyamilama Dam in the Kwimba District.

34. *Bungulwa Dam Controlled Area, Kwimba District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Bungulwa Dam in the Kwimba District.

35. *Mantare Dam Controlled Area, Kwimba District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Mantare Dam in the Kwimba District.

36. *Jojiro Dam Controlled Area, Kwimba District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Jojiro Dam in the Kwimba District.

37. *Lake Kwela Controlled Area, Ufipa, District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area lying within one mile of the high water mark of Lake Kwela in the Ufipa District.

## 38. Deleted.

39. *Kakora Dam Controlled Area, Kwimba District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Kakora Dam near Ngudu, Kwimba District.

40. *Mondo Dam Controlled Area, Kwimba District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Mondo Dam in the Usmao Chiefdom of Kwimba District.

41. *Susijanda Swamp Controlled Area, Nzega District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of three miles from a beacon placed beside the District Commissioner's Rest Camp at Susijanda in the Nzega District.

42. *Chinamili Dam Controlled Area, Maswa District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Chinamili Dam in the Maswa District.

43. *Buyubi Dam Controlled Area, Maswa District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Buyubi Dam in the Maswa District.

44. *Chinamwiguru Dam Controlled Area, Maswa District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Chinamwiguru Dam in the Maswa District.

45. *Iborogero Dam Controlled Area, Maswa District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Iborogero Dam in the Maswa District.

46. *Silimuka Dam Controlled Area, Nzega District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Silimuka Dam in the Nzega District.

47. *The Alamasí Mine Controlled Area, Shinyanga District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of three miles from the centre of the retaining wall of the Alamasí Mine Dam registered as Water Right No. 32 in the Shinyanga District.

48. *Ugalla River Controlled Area, Tabora and Mpanda Districts.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at the junction of the Ugalla and the Msima River, the boundary shall follow a northerly direction to a beacon situated on the east side of the Kaliua-Mpanda railway on the Lumbe Mbuga; thence in an easterly direction along a cleared and beaconsed line to a beacon beside the Nyumbu-Siri track; thence in a south-easterly direction along a cleared and beaconsed line to a beacon on the left border of the Tabora-Nyonga Road reserve; thence following the left border of the Tabora-Nyonga Road reserve in a south-westerly direction to the intersection of the said road with the Ugalla River at Isimbira; thence in a westerly direction along a cleared and beaconsed line to a beacon on the left bank of the Msima River; thence in a north-westerly direction following the left bank of the Msima River downstream to its junction with the Ugalla River, which is the point of commencement:

Provided that nothing in this Schedule shall be deemed to prohibit fishing in the Ugalla Controlled Area by person in exercise of native customary rights.

49. *The Handeni Dam Controlled Area, Handeni District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Handeni Dam in the Handeni District.

50. *Songwa Controlled Area, Shinyanga District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at the most northerly point of the eastern boundary of the Shinyanga Controlled Area in a direct line due east to the Mwanza-Shinyanga Road, thence following that road south-easterly to the mile-stone at mile 84 from Mwanza, thence along a straight line from mile 84 to the most northerly point of AML 517 to where that line meets the Williamson Diamond Mine Controlled Area (item 10 hereof) thence southwards following the western boundary of the Williamson Diamond Controlled Area to its most southerly point of intersection with the Mwanza-Shinyanga Road; thence in a direct line due west to a point where it meets the Shinyanga Controlled Area; thence northwards following the eastern boundary of the Shinyanga Controlled Area to the point of commencement.

51. *Lake Daramatai Controlled Area, Kondoa District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area lying within one hundred yards of the high water mark of Lake Daramatai on the Bubu River in Kondoa District:

Provided that nothing in this Schedule shall be deemed to prohibit fishing in the Lake Daramati Controlled Area by persons in exercise of native customary rights.

52. *Doma-Mikumi Controlled Area, Morogoro and Kilosa Districts.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at a beacon situated at mile 32 from Kilosa on the east side of the Kilosa-Mikumi road, the boundary shall follow a cleared and beaconsed line in a north-easterly direction to a beacon situated on the east side of the Kilosa-Mikumi railway track approximately one mile south of Mbamba hill; thence following a cleared and beaconsed line in an easterly, then northerly direction for approximately one mile to a beacon situated on the southern boundary of the Mkata Ranch; thence following the said ranch boundary in an easterly direction to a beacon situated approximately two miles west of the main Morogoro-Iringa road; thence in a south-easterly direction to a beacon situated on the west side of the Morogoro-Iringa road approximately two miles south of the Msongozi River bridge; thence following the west side of the Morogoro-Iringa road northwards for approximately half a mile to its point of intersection with the Maharaka track; thence following the said Maharaka track in a generally south-south-westerly direction to a beacon situated approximately 5.8 miles along the track; thence in a southerly, then westerly direction along a beaconsed line, parallel to and five miles east and south of the Morogoro-Iringa road to a beacon situated on the east bank of the Luhembe river; thence following the east bank of the said river north-westwards (upstream) to a beacon situated approximately two miles south of the intersection of the Morogoro-Iringa and Kilosa-Ifakara roads at Mikumi Village; thence following a cleared and beaconsed line in a north-easterly direction to a beacon situated at mile 70 from Morogoro on the Morogoro-Iringa road; thence following a cleared and beaconsed line in a westerly direction to a beacon situated on the east side of the Kilosa-Ifakara road approximately two miles north of the intersection of the Morogoro-Iringa and Kilosa-Ifakara road; thence following the east side of the Kilosa-Ifakara road in a northerly direction to the point of commencement.

53. *Nyambiti Dam Controlled Area, Kwimba District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Nyambiti Dam, in the Kwimba District.

54. *Mwamanga Dam Controlled Area, Kwimba District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Mwamanga Dam in the Kwimba District.

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55. *Kenyelali Dam Controlled Area, Kwimba District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Kenyelali Dam in the Kwimba District.

56. *Kigala Dam Controlled Area, Kwimba District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Kigala Dam in the Kwimba District.

57. *Koromiji Dam Controlled Area, Kwimba District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Koromiji Dam in the Kwimba District.

58. *Ngeju Njiro Dam Controlled Area, Masai District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Ngeju Njiro Dam, Masai District.

59. *The Nembe Swamp Controlled Area, Mwanza District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area lying within one mile of the high water mark of the Nembe Swamp, Mwanza District.

60. *Sima Dam Controlled Area, Nzega District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of one mile from the centre of the retaining wall of the Sima Dam in the Nzega District.

61. *Maswa Controlled Area, Maswa and Mwanza Districts.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at the point where the Mbalangeti river enters Lake Victoria the boundary follows the left bank of the said river upstream in an easterly direction to the eastern boundary of the Musoma-Mwanza territorial main road which is on the boundary of the Serengeti National Park; thence in a southerly and easterly direction following the boundary of the said national park to beacon No. SNP. 49 situated on Ndugani Kopje; thence north-eastwards continuing along the boundary of the Serengeti National Park to beacon No. SNP. 41; thence due south to a point beside the road from Kakesio to Nyalikiungu; thence in a westerly direction following the said road through Kimale to Itinje; thence northwards along the road to Kisesa; thence eastwards along the Kimbaga road to a point due north of Baluli Hill; thence north to Bukwaya Dam; thence north to Dugudi Hill near the source of the Gidamunida river; thence following the left bank of the Gidamunida river downstream in a north-westerly direction to its confluence with the Duma river; thence in a northerly direction to Masewa Hill; thence following the left bank of the Mwamodea river downstream to its confluence with the Ramadi river; thence down the left bank of the Ramadi river to the point where it enters Lake Victoria; thence following the lake shore in a northerly direction to the point of commencement.

62. Deleted.

63. *Speke Gulf Controlled Area, Musoma and Mwanza Districts.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at the bridge on the Musoma-Mwanza road over the Ruwana River the boundary line shall follow the western border of the said road in a southerly direction to the bridge over the Mbalangeti River; then in a westerly direction following the left bank of the Mbalangeti River to the point of entry of this river into Lake Victoria; thence in a northerly direction following the shore of Lake Victoria to the point of entry of the Ruwana River into Lake Victoria; thence in an easterly direction following the right (north) bank of the Ruwana River to the bridge on the Musoma-Mwanza road, the point of commencement:

Provided that nothing in this Schedule shall be deemed to prohibit fishing in the Speke Gulf Controlled Area by persons in exercise of native customary rights.

64. *Grumeti River Controlled Area, Musoma District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at the confluence of the Grumeti with the Ruwana river the boundary shall follow the right (north) bank of the Ruwana river upstream to its intersection with the Ikizu-Banagi road; thence following the left side of the said road in an easterly direction to its intersection with the Bukole stream; thence following the right bank of the Bukole stream to its junction with the Orangi river; thence following the right bank of consecutively the Orangi and Grumeti rivers to the point of commencement.

65. *Mkungunero Controlled Area, Kondo District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at a beacon on the Mbulu-Kondo District boundary where the said boundary crosses the Chubi Mbuga, the boundary follows the eastern

edge of the Chubi Mbuga in a southerly direction to the Busi-Makuyuni motor track; thence in a north-easterly direction to the junction of the said track with the Kondo-Masai District boundary; thence it follows the said District boundary to the Ol Donyo Lolguberi Hill; thence it follows the Mbulu-Kondo District boundary (the southern boundary of the Tarangire Game Reserve) in a westerly direction to the point of commencement.

66. *Ibanda Controlled Area, Bukoba District.*

*Boundaries.*—From the Murongo ferry south along the west side of the Murongo-Kaisho road to a beacon situated on the west side of the road near the highest point on the Rwabanuka Hill, thence in a straight line in a south-westerly direction to the International Boundary Post No. 72A situated on the right bank of the Kagera River, thence following the International Boundary downstream along the centre of the Kagera River to the point of commencement.

67. *Amani Lake Controlled Area, Tanga District.*

*Boundaries.*—All that area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of half a mile from the point where the Amani-Monga road bridge crosses the Dodwe River half a mile north-west of the Amani Post Office.

68. *The Kalimawe Controlled Area, Same and Lushoto Districts.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at the bridge on the Mkomazi-Kihurio road over the Mkomazi River, the boundary shall follow the west bank of the Mkomazi River upstream (northwards) to its confluence with the Kambaga River; thence upstream along the west bank of the Kambaga River to its confluence with the Kisiwani River; thence upstream along the west bank of the Kisiwani River to a beacon situated on a bearing of approximately 310 degrees from the summit of Masanzali Hill; thence in a south-easterly direction on a bearing of approximately 130 degrees to the summit of Masanzali Hill; thence in a south-easterly direction on a bearing of approximately 133 degrees to the Kashugu water hole which is situated about two miles north of Mabili (Upare) Hill; thence in a south-easterly direction on a bearing of approximately 145 degrees to the summit of Mabili (Usambaa) Hill; thence in a north-easterly direction to the summit of Karambatu Hill; thence in an easterly direction to Musambura water hole; thence in an easterly direction to the summit of Kigongojiwa-Kubwa Ridge; thence in a south-easterly direction to the summit of Mazunya Hill; thence in a southerly direction to a beacon on the south bank of the Uмба River approximately one and a half miles east of the confluence of the Mbaramu and Uмба Rivers; thence following the south bank of the Mbaramu River upstream (north-westwards then westwards) to the village of Mnazi; thence in a westerly direction along the Mnazi-Kihurio motor-track to the bridge on the Mkomazi-Kihurio road, the point of commencement.

69. *Lolkisale Controlled Area, Masai District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at beacon No. 1 on the summit of Oldonyo Loldorobo the boundary follows a cleared and beacons line in a southerly direction through beacons Nos. 2, 3, 4 to the summit of Oldonyo Sambu; thence through beacons Nos. 5 and 6 to the summit of Oldonyo Lolkrnan; thence in a south-westerly direction to the summit of Oldonyo Ngahari which is situated on the boundary between Masai District and Mbulu District; thence in a north-westerly direction following the said inter-district boundary to beacon No. 7 situated 5 miles south-east of Kwakuchinja; thence in a north-easterly direction along a cleared and beacons track to beacon No. 8 on the north bank of the Makuyuni River situated 5 miles south-east of Makuyuni; thence in a south-easterly direction following the north bank of the said Makuyuni River for a distance of approximately 1 mile to beacon No. 9; thence in an east-south-easterly direction along a cleared and beacons line through beacons Nos. 10, 11, 12 to beacon No. 13 situated on the east bank of the Makuyuni River; thence upstream in a southerly direction along the east bank of the Makuyuni River to beacon No. 14 situated due east of Loldorobo Hill; thence in a westerly direction to beacon No. 1 the point of commencement.

70. *The Rau Forest Controlled Area, Moshi District.*

*Boundaries.*—The boundaries of the Rau Forest Reserve, as defined in a Proclamation made under section 4 of the Forests Ordinance.

71. *Endulen Controlled Area, Masai District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at a point on the north shore of Lake Eyasi due south of beacon No. SNP. 41, the boundary shall follow a straight line due north to its intersection with the Kimali-Ngorongoro road; thence in an easterly direction following the left side of the said road to a point lying due south of Lemagrut Mountain; thence in southerly direction to the point of intersection of the southern boundary of the Northern Highlands Forest Reserve with the Masai-Mbulu district boundary; thence following the said district boundary in a southerly direction to the shore of Lake Eyasi; thence following the north shore of Lake Eyasi in a south-westerly direction to the point of commencement.

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72. *Igombe Dam Controlled Area, Tabora District.*

*Boundaries.*—All that parcel of land comprising 29.3 square miles or 18,752 acres, situated in the Tabora District to the west of the Old Tabora-Mwanza Road north of Itaga (Territorial Map Reference Africa 1 in 1 million Tabora) as delineated on Forest Department plan No. Jb. 301 deposited with the Department of Lands and Surveys and bounded as follows:—

*East:* Starting from beacon No. 1 situated on the right of Igombe River, where this river is crossed by the old road Tabora-Mwanza 18 miles north of Tabora; thence southwards by this road for a distance of  $9\frac{1}{2}$  miles to beacon No. 2.

*South:* From beacon No. 2, westwards on a bearing of 250 degrees for a distance of 2 miles and 300 yards to beacon No. 3 on Igombe-Tabora pipe line.

*West:* From beacon No. 3 northwards by this pipe line for a distance of 2 miles and 270 yards to beacon No. 4; thence by a cut line along the southward slopes of the Igombiro Hills for a distance of 1 mile and 250 yards to beacon No. 5; thence by a cut line on a bearing of 360 degrees for a distance of 8 miles 115 yards to beacon No. 6.

*North:* From beacon No. 6 eastwards, by a cut line on a bearing of 90 degrees for a distance of 3 miles to beacon No. 1, the point of commencement.

All bearings are magnetic.

All distances are approximate.

73. *Ugunda Controlled Area, Tabora District.*

*Boundaries.*—From Igalula on the Tabora-Nyonga road the boundary follows the Igalula-Ipole track in a south-easterly direction to Ipole on the Sikonge-Rungwa road; thence along the Sikonge-Rungwa road in a south-easterly direction to a beacon situated midway between the points where the Kwasi and Nkululu rivers respectively cross the said road; thence west-north-westwards along a cleared and beacons line to the confluence of the Kwasi and Nkululu rivers at the Lutemo pool; thence following the north bank of the Ugalla river downstream west-north-westwards to the bridge at Isimbira on the Tabora-Mpanda road; thence following the Mpanda-Tabora road in a north-easterly direction to the point of commencement.

74. *Luganzo Controlled Area, Tabora District.*

*Boundaries.*—From Kaliuwa Railway Station the boundary follows the Kaliuwa-Mpanda railway line in a south-westerly direction to a beacon on the east side of the said railway line on the Lumbe Mbuga at approximately Km. 67; thence southwards along a cleared and beacons line to the beacon which marks the north-west corner of the Ugalla river Controlled Area; thence southwards following the western boundary of the Ugalla river Controlled Area to the junction of the Msima and Ugalla rivers; thence downstream along the Ugalla river to its junction with the Malagarasi river; thence upstream along the Malagarasi river to the point where it is crossed by the Central Railway line; thence eastwards along the said railway line to Kaliuwa Railway Station, the point of commencement.

75. *Gombe Controlled Area, Tabora District.*

*Boundaries.*—From Kaliuwa Railway Station the boundary follows the Central Railway Line westwards to the point where it crosses the Malagarasi river; thence following the south bank of the Malagarasi river upstream in a north-easterly direction to its confluence with the Moyowosi river; thence following the south bank of the Moyowosi river upstream in a north-easterly direction to a beacon situated at the point where the Moyowosi river leaves the south end of the lake formed by the confluence of the Moyowosi and Mkombo rivers; thence following a beacon line eastwards and northwards around the periphery of the said lake to the point where the Mkombo river enters it; thence following the south bank of the Mkombo river upstream in an easterly direction to a beacon situated at its confluence with the Gombe river; thence along a beacons line following the Mkwala Mbuga in a south-easterly direction to the point where the Kaliuwa-Uyowa track crosses the said Mbuga; thence following the Kaliuwa-Uyowa track south-westwards to Kaliuwa Railway Station, the point of commencement.

76. *Kigosi Controlled Area, Tabora and Kahama Districts.*

*Boundaries.*—From beacon No. 7 on the boundary of the Nikonga River Forest Reserve eleven miles west of Ushiroambo on the main road Kahama-Biharamulo the boundary follows that of the Nikonga River Forest Reserve to south of the Busonge waterhole on the Kigosi river, thence leaving the Forest Reserve boundary continues southerly in a straight line to the source of the Mtoni river near Bugomba village; thence downstream along the west bank of the Mtoni river to its confluence with the Gombe river; thence following the left bank of the Gombe river downstream in a southerly and westerly direction to its confluence with the Mkombo river; thence downstream along the left bank of the Mkombo river to a beacon situated at the point where the said river enters the lake formed by its confluence with the Moyowosi river; thence in a westerly direction along a beacons line following the north edge of

the said lake to the point where the Moyowosi river enters it; thence upstream following the left bank of the Moyowosi river to its confluence with the Nikonga river; thence following the western and northern boundaries of the Nikonga River Forest Reserve north and then east to the point of commencement.

77. *Missungwe Dam Controlled Area, Mwanza District.*

*Boundaries.*—That area of land in the Mwanza District which lies within one mile of the centre of the retaining wall of the Missungwe Dam.

78. Deleted.

79. *The Mto wa Mbu Controlled Area, Masai District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at the top of the Rift Wall where the Longabolo (or Mkuyuni) stream flows over the said wall, the boundary follows the southern boundary of the North Masailand Controlled Area eastwards to a beacon sited on the summit of Matawato Hill; thence in a southerly direction to a beacon sited at the north-east corner of the Monduli Forest Reserve boundary; thence along the southern boundary of the said forest reserve in a south-westerly direction to the point of intersection with the boundary of Monduli Minor Settlement; thence following the boundaries of the Monduli Minor Settlement to the point of intersection of the western boundary of the said settlement with the boundary of the Monduli Forest Reserve; thence in a south and westerly direction along the boundary of the said forest reserve to a beacon sited on top of Monduli Juu ridge; thence following the said ridge in a south-westerly direction to a beacon sited on the northern boundary of the Burko Forest Reserve; thence in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary of the said forest reserve to the north-east boundary beacon of Essimingor Farm No. 1; thence following the western boundaries of the Essimingor Farms Nos. 1, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 to a beacon sited on the Makuyuni-Mto-wa-Mbu Road; thence following the said road in an easterly direction to the north-west boundary beacon of Farm Farab No. 11; thence following the western boundary of the said farm in a south-south-westerly direction to the point of intersection with the Mbulu/Masai inter-district boundary; thence in a north-westerly direction along the said inter-district boundary to its point of intersection with the high water line of Lake Manyara; thence northwards along the high water line of the lake to Manyara National Park boundary post No. 20; thence following in a northerly direction the boundaries of the Lake Manyara National Park to Manyara National Park boundary post No. 2 sited on the west bank of the Kiruruma River; thence following the west (right) bank of the Kiruruma River upstream to its sources on the top of the Rift Wall; thence following the top of the Rift Wall northwards to the point where the Longabolo (or Mkuyuni) stream flows over the Rift Wall, the point of commencement.

80. *Msima Controlled Area, Mpanda District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at Isimbira at the point where the Tabora-Nyonga road crosses the Ugalla River, the boundary follows the said road in a southerly direction to the point where the Mpanda road leaves it, thence in a westerly direction along this Mpanda road to its point of intersection with the Mtambo River; thence following the Mtambo River downstream (northwards) to its confluence with the Ugalla River; thence following the Ugalla River upstream (eastwards) to its confluence with the Msima River, this point being on the western boundary of the Ugalla Controlled Area; thence following the western and southern boundaries of the Ugalla Controlled Area south-eastwards then eastwards to Isimbira, the point of commencement.

81. *Nyonga Controlled Area, Mpanda and Tabora Districts.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at Isimbira at the point where the Tabora-Mpanda road crosses the Ugalla River the boundary follows the southern boundary of the Uganda Controlled Area in an easterly direction to the point where it meets the Sikonge-Rungwa road; thence following the said road in a southerly then easterly direction to the point where it crosses the Musa River; thence following the said river downstream (westwards) to its confluence with the Mawina River; thence following the Mawina River upstream (northwards) to the point where it is crossed by the Kitunda-Nyonga road; thence following the said road in a westerly direction to Nyonga settlement; thence following the Nyonga-Tabora road in a northerly direction to Isimbira, the point of commencement.

82. *Mlele Controlled Area, Mpanda District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at Sitalike on the Mpanda-Sumbawanga road the boundary shall follow the Sitalike-Kakenko-Uruwira track in a north-easterly direction to Uruwira; thence following the Mpanda-Nyonga road in an easterly direction to its junction with the Tabora-Nyonga road; thence in a southerly direction along the Tabora-Nyonga road to Nyonga settlement; thence along the Nyonga-Rungwa road in a south-westerly direction to Rungwa settlement; thence along the Rungwa-Usevia-Mitumba road in a westerly direction to the junction with the Usevia-Ikuu-Sikitiko road about 5 miles west of Usevia village; thence following the said road in a northerly direction to the point where it crosses the southern boundary of the Katavi Game Reserve; thence following the said boundary, eastwards, then northwards, then north-eastwards to Sitalike village, the point of commencement.

83. *Kitwai Controlled Area, Masai District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at Ngasumet village on the Naberera-Ruvu-Rimiti road, the boundary shall follow the said road in an east-south-easterly direction to the Ruvu River at Ruvu Rimiti village; thence following the right bank of the said river downstream in the same direction to its point of intersection with the Northern/Tanga inter-provincial boundary; thence following the said inter-provincial boundary in a south-west, then southerly direction to its point of intersection with the Kibaya-Kijungu-Handeni motor road; thence following the said road in a westerly direction to the village of Kijungu; thence following the Kijungu-Kitwai-Ngasumet road in a northerly direction to Ngasumet, the point of commencement.

84. Deleted.

85. *The Uмба River Controlled Area, Lushoto and Tanga Districts.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at the confluence of the Mbaramu and Uмба Rivers the boundary shall follow the south bank of the Uмба River to a point due south of Gerevi Hill; thence due north through the summit of Gerevi Hill to the Kenya-Tanganyika boundary; thence following the Kenya-Tanganyika boundary in a south-easterly direction to its point of intersection with the Uмба River; thence following the south bank of the Uмба River upstream (westwards) to its confluence with the Bombo River thence following the east bank of the Bombo River, southwards to a beacon three miles from the said confluence; thence following a cleared and beaconsed line on a magnetic bearing of approximately 274 degrees for a distance of approximately four miles to a beacon at the north end of Kalalani Ridge; thence following a cleared and beaconsed line on a magnetic bearing of approximately 245 degrees for a distance of approximately eight miles to a beacon approximately three miles south of Mito Mingi (where the Uмба River breaks up into a number of channels); thence following a cleared and beaconsed line on a magnetic bearing of approximately 296 degrees for a distance of approximately eight miles to a beacon approximately three miles due south of the confluence of the Mbaramu and Uмба Rivers; thence in a straight line to the point of commencement.

86. *The Hombolo Dam Controlled Area, Dodoma District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of 6 miles from the centre of the retaining wall of the Hombolo Dam, Dodoma District.

87. *The Ikowa Dam Controlled Area, Dodoma District.*

*Boundaries.*—The area comprised within the circumference of a circle having a radius of 6 miles from the centre of the retaining wall of the Ikowa Dam, Dodoma District.

88. *The Chabula Marsh Controlled Area, Mwanza District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at the junction of the eastern boundary of the track leading to Nyangombe Primary School with the northern road reserve boundary of the Mwanza-Musoma main road approximately 16 miles from Mwanza, on a bearing of 50 degrees for a distance of approximately 5,000 yards to the highest point on a rocky outcrop known as Kiwambi; thence continuing on a bearing of 50 degrees for a distance of approximately 3,900 yards to the shore of Lake Victoria; thence along the Lake shore in a north-westerly direction to the east bank of the Ihayabuyaga river; thence along the east bank of the Ihayabuyaga river in a southerly direction to the northern boundary of the Mwanza-Musoma main road reserve; thence along the road reserve boundary in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 1,100 yards to the point of commencement.

89. *The Lukwati Controlled Area, Chunya District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at the point where the Yeye river cuts through the East Rukwa escarpment, the boundary shall follow the north bank of this river upstream to a point 2 miles north-west of Mpungu peak; thence to Kilundo village; thence in a straight line due east to the Makambe river; thence following the west bank of the same river downstream to its confluence with the Rungwa river; thence following the south bank of the Rungwa river upstream to its confluence with the Muipa river; thence following the south bank of the Muipa river upstream to the point where it is crossed by the Lukwati-Mdabulo road; thence in a south-westerly direction along the south side of the road for approximately 10 miles to the junction of this road with the Lukwati-Rungwa road; thence in a north-westerly direction for approximately 2 miles along the west side of the Lukwati-Rungwa road to a beacon; thence continuing in a north-westerly direction to a beacon on Ilela hill; thence in a south-westerly direction by a series of straight lines through beacons on Mwendo hill and Kimpula rock to a beacon on Chauga hill; thence westwards in a straight line to a beacon on the east bank of the Lago river; thence downstream along the east bank of the same river to the point where it cuts through the East Rukwa escarpment; thence in a north-westerly direction along the top of this escarpment to the Yeye river, the point of commencement.

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90. *The Njingwe Controlled Area, Kibondo District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at beacon No. 1 erected on the east bank of the Malagarasi river at the point of junction of the Kibondo, Kasulu and Kigoma district boundaries, the boundary shall follow the Kibondo-Kasulu district boundaries in a northerly direction to the south-west corner beacon of the Mwalye Forest Reserve; thence following the southern boundary of the Mwalye Forest Reserve in an easterly direction to the Moyowoshi river; thence following the west bank of the Moyowoshi river southwards (downstream) to beacon No. 2 erected at the point where the Moyowoshi river diverges from the Kibondo-Tabora inter-district boundary; thence following the said inter-district boundary in a westerly direction to beacon No. 1, the point of commencement.

91. *The Moyowoshi Controlled Area, Kibondo District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at a beacon erected on the east bank of the Malagarasi river where the said river crosses the main Kasulu-Kibondo road, the boundary shall follow the western boundary of the Mwalye Forest Reserve in a northerly direction to the point of junction of the said boundary with the boundary of the Buyungu Forest Reserve; thence following the western boundary of the Buyungu Forest Reserve in a north-easterly direction to the Moyowoshi river; thence following the west bank of the Moyowoshi river in a southerly direction downstream to the south-east beacon of the Mwalye Forest Reserve; thence following the southern boundary of the said Forest Reserve in a westerly direction to the beacon on the Malagarasi river which is the point of commencement.

92. *The Longido Controlled Area, Masai District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at boundary post 47 on the Tanganyika-Kenya border, situated north of Kitenden, the boundary shall follow a westerly direction through the summits in turn of Ketumbellion, Nimbolingi, Ngaserai and Muru Hills to a beacon situated west of Muru Hill on the western edge of the road reserve of the Arusha-Nairobi road; thence following the western edge of the said road reserve in a northerly direction to the Tanganyika-Kenya border near Namanga; thence in a south-easterly direction following the said border to boundary post 47 which is the point of commencement.

93. *The Lake Natron Controlled Area, Masai District.*

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at Masapi village on the Njamkala (Kimbi) River, the boundary shall follow the motor road south to its crossing over the Njamkala (Kimbi) River; thence following the right bank of the Njakapembe River to its confluence with the Great Ruaha River thence downstream along the right bank of the Great Ruaha River to its confluence with the Madawi stream; thence along the left bank of the Madawi stream to its crossing with the Madibira-Urwani motor road; thence along the Madibira-Urwani road northwards through Urwani village to its junction with the Great Ruaha River at the former site of Husmann's Bridge; thence upstream along the left bank of the Great Ruaha River to its confluence with the Njakapembe River; thence along the left bank of the Njakapembe River to Masapi village which is the point of commencement.

101. *Kizigo Controlled Area, Manyoni District.*

7. *Central Railways Partial Game Reserve.*

8. *Kondoa Partial Game Reserve, Central Region.*

The hunting of roan antelope is prohibited in the Kondoa District.

9. *Southern Region Partial Game Reserve.*

The hunting of rhinoceros is prohibited in the Southern Region.

10. Deleted.

11. *Sable Partial Game Reserve.*

The hunting of sable antelope is prohibited throughout the Tanga, Lushoto, Pangani and Handeni Districts of the Tanga Region and the Masai District of the Arusha Region.

12. *The Ulanga Partial Game Reserve, Ulanga District.*

The hunting of rhinoceros, greater kudu and Nyasaland wildebeest is prohibited in the Ulanga District.

13.-15. Deleted.

16. *The Karagwe Partial Game Reserve, Karagwe District.*

The hunting of sitatunga is prohibited throughout the area of Lake Rushwa in the Karagwe District of which the boundaries are described below:—

*Boundaries.*—Commencing at beacon No. 1 situated on the eastern edge of the Bugene-Kaisho road about half a mile from the eastern tip of Lake Rushwa, the boundary shall run due west to beacon No. 2 sited on the east shore of Lake Rushwa, thence due west across the swamps to the international boundary post No. 68 on the Tanganyika-Rwanda boundary; thence following the said international boundary north-westwards to boundary post No. 69 situated near Igabiro; thence in an east-south-easterly direction to beacon No. 3 situated at the pumping station of the Kyerwa Syndicate Ltd.'s mine; thence in an east-north-easterly direction to beacon No. 4 situated on the east side of the Bugene-Kaisho road, thence following the said road in a south-easterly direction to beacon No. 1, the point of commencement.

17. *The Arusha Region Partial Game Reserve, Masai and Mbulu Districts.*

The hunting of Zebra and Thomson's Gazelle is prohibited throughout the area of Masai and Mbulu Districts lying to the East and South of the Great North Road.
